



Not much time? these places are just a stone's throw away



Do you need a cute souvenir or a cuddly present for a young relative? How about a Paddington Bear? If you remember, Michael Bond's fictional bear came from Peru and this is where you can now see a large statue of him along the promenade in Parque Salazar. Designed by Stephen Fry, it was donated to Peru by the British Embassy.



Colonial history buff? Check out Pueblo Libre, so-called because of its role in the liberation of Peru in 1821 by Jose de San Martin. Here, you can visit the pretty main square (Parque 3 de Octubre) with a huge bust of Bolivar and an old train carriage. Just off the square stands the Antigua Taberna Queirolo, a traditional tavern belonging to the Queirolo Pisco Company which has wooden panelling, high bars and lots of old photos. A real gem!





If you're a cat-lover, be sure to visit Parque Kennedy, a vibrant square in the heart of Miraflores which is a sanctuary for our feline friends.



If you have time for a short trip, be sure to take a taxi to La Punta, a small peninsula standing a mere two metres above sealevel in the North Lima port area. Enjoy a peaceful stroll around this upscale area which has an intense crime-prevention plan. View the beautiful architecture of its historical buildings and take a walk down its pier.



No time to visit Machu Picchu? Did you know that without venturing outside Lima you can visit ancient Pre-Incan temples? One of these is the Huaca Pucllana site which sits majestically, though somewhat incongruously, in the middle of modern tower block in the Miraflores district.

Climb up the ramps to the top of the 25-meter-high pyramid made of millions of adobe and clay bricks patted into shape by hand (you can still see ancient fingerprints on many blocks).





Are you a romantic? Barranco is for you!! Stroll around and enjoy the unhurried, laid-back atmosphere. This is the Bohemian quarter of Lima with many beautiful buildings dating from the early 20th century. Visit the many art museums and eat on one of the terraces in the Barranco gorge hanging down the cliffside. Don't miss the bridge over the "barranco", which has a wonderful legend.






Staying Longer? These are a must to visit



Looking for a seaside experience? 40 km south of Lima centre you can find **San Bartolo**, a picturesque beach resort popular with beachgoes and surfers alike. Here, you can savour a dish of ceviche or fresh seafood at one of the many restaurants along the attractive seafront.



Want to explore outside the capital, but don't have much time? You won't regret a visit to **Pachacamac**. This is a sprawling, pre-Incan archaeological site just 40 kms south of downtown Lima. Discover its amazing temples and pyramids and enjoy breathtaking views along the coastal plain. If you're a dog lover, you may also see a Peruvian hairless dog - part of the national heritage.
